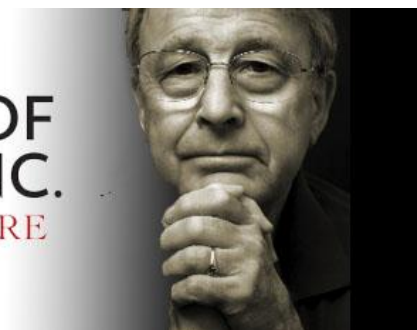

Reverend Patrick J. Sullivan C.S.C., Ph.D

Reverend Sullivan received his A.B. from Notre Dame University in Philosophy and American Catholic History in 1952. From there he obtained his Theological Training in Washington, DC, his M.A. from Fordham University in Sociology, his Ph.D from the Catholic University in Sociology and American Catholic History, Public Ethics at Yale University, a NSF Grant in Anthropology from the University of Colorado, Boulder and his Social Psychology Course at Columbia University, New York.

He began his career as Chairman & Assistant Professor of Sociology at Kings College in Wilkes-Barre, Penn. From there he served as Chaplain at the State Correctional Institution at Dallas-Chase in Penn. He was the Director of Urban Affairs in Washington, DC, the Director of Personnel and Planning at Holy Cross Father, Notre Dame, the Executive Coordinator at the NACPA, the Catholic Liaison at JP Stevens, New York, the Adjunct Associate Professor, Dept. of Sociology at the University of Notre Dame, Director of Undergraduate Program and Associate Director of Higgins Labor Research Center also at Notre Dame, Lecturer in Sociology and Public Policy and Research Institute at King's College, Secretary and Treasurer, Catholic Scholars for Worker Justice, 2009 to present and Executive Secretary and Chaplain for the Labor Guild, Archdioceses of Boston, Mass, 2009 to present.

Reverend Sullivan has written many books including, *Labor Priest Vignettes*, *Blue Collar-Roman Collar-White Collar: Catholic Involvement in Labor-Management Controversies*, *Catholic Institutions and Labor-Unions* and *Issues in the Labor-Management Dialogue* to name a few. He also has had articles published in *America*, *Emmanuel*, *Sojourners* and the U.S. Catholic Historian.
